Fast Train to Service™

I have been asked to serve as your District Treasurer by our new District Governor Lion Dean and I thank him for the opportunity to once again serve our District.

As our fiscal year comes to an end and IPDG Lion George leaves office, I would like to remind the current Treasurers of each of the clubs about a few items that must be done before November 15, 2012. First, if your total income for your club (that is any funds raised for the benefit of the community (project/activities funds) and your administrative funds total less than \$50,000 you only need to file form 990-N (an e-postcard) with the IRS. You can go to this site to file the informational return: <http://epostcard.form990.org>. This is the organization with which you will file for the Federal return. In order to file this form you will need the following eight items:



1. Employer Identification number (this is the number used when you opened your bank account.
2. The tax year – since we end our fiscal year in June this tax year will be the 2011 year.
3. Legal name and mailing address. The name you list on the first line will be the “International Association of Lions Clubs.
4. List your club name underneath along with your clubs mailing address.
5. Name and address of a principal officer – usually the treasurer.
6. Website address if you have one
7. Confirm that your club’s gross receipts are \$50,000 or less for this tax year (July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012). Gross means all money deposited in to your two bank accounts.
8. If your club is surrendering its charter then tell the IRS that this is your final return.

If you income from both sources is over \$25,000 but less than \$50,000 you will need to file a 199 with the Franchise Tax Board. This form can be found at the following website: www.ftb.ca.gov/forms/2011/11_199.pdf. This form can be filled out on line and mailed to the Franchise Tax Board at Franchise Tax Board, P O Box 942857, Sacramento, CA 94257-0701. This form requires a \$10.00 filing fee if postmarked on or before November 15, 2012. This check must be written out of your Administrative checking account.

If your clubs total receipts are under \$25,000 for both project and administrative you can also file the 199N for California. This can be done by going to this website: www.ftb.ca.gov/online/199N_ePostcard/. You will again need your Federal Tax number and your California corporate number. If you do not have a CA number, use your Federal ID.

Lions International Dues Increase

Dues increase:

A resolution to increase International Dues to be phased in over two years was voted and approved by the membership at the International Convention. The Dues increase will be effective July 1, 2012.

Dues will be billed as follows:

MEMBERSHIP DUES.

- (a) Semi-annual membership dues of twenty dollars and fifty cents (US\$20.50) denominated in U.S. dollars shall be levied on each club member during the 2012-13 term, beginning July 1, 2012.
- (b) Semi-annual membership dues of twenty-one dollars and fifty cents (US\$21.50) denominated in U.S. dollars shall be levied on each member during the 2013-14 term, beginning July 1, 2013.
- (c) For family membership programs as adopted by the International Board of Directors, the following dues shall apply:
 - (1) The first family member, Head of Household, shall pay semi-annual membership dues as provided in sub-section (a) or (b) above, depending on the term.
 - (2) Subsequent qualifying family members, not to exceed four additional qualifying members per household, shall pay semi-annual membership dues equal to one-half (1/2) of the total amount paid by the first family member as described in subsection (c)(1).
- (d) For student membership programs as adopted by the International Board of Directors, eligible student members shall pay semi-annual membership dues equal to one-half (1/2) of the total amount of dues as provided in sub-section (a) or (b) above, depending on the term.

International Dues do not include District or State dues. Semi-annual dues are billed as follows: July- December and January-June.

LIONS CLUBS COMBINE EFFORTS TO SALUTE OUR WOUNDED HEROES

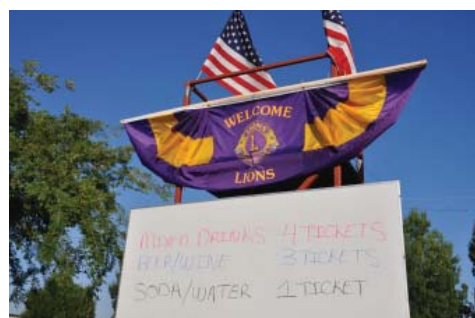
Three neighboring Lions Clubs in the central San Joaquin Valley in California combined their skills and talents on a fundraiser titled Salute Our Wounded Heroes. Proudly patriotic and wanting to do something to give back primarily to the soldiers and their families affected by the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan, they held a dinner, dance and auction this past May 19th, and managed to raise \$111,000. Salute Our Wounded Heroes was an effort to raise money to help two outstanding organizations that provide support services for our wounded soldiers and their families. One is the Special Operations Warrior Foundation, a four-star charity that provides scholarships and monetary support for the children of Special Ops soldiers killed in the line of duty. The second is a charity called Homes Fit for Heroes, a group that provides quality housing for soldiers and their families as they undergo hospitalization and rehabilitation following injury on the battlefield. These accommodations go above and beyond what can be provided by the military so that these heroes can heal under the best possible conditions.

The Caruthers Lions Club took the lead in the combined effort to give back to those who have given so much for the freedoms we have come to expect but often take for granted as Americans. Equally important were the talents and hard work of the Riverdale Lions and Easton Lions Clubs. The communities of Caruthers, Easton and Riverdale are all small farming towns located south of the larger city of Fresno. None have a stop light or even a stop sign on their main drags. None have their own police force or city council. In fact, none of the three has a population larger than two thousand residents. As a result, the three townships tend to rely on their respective Lions Clubs for support for a wide range of needs, including scholarships, eyeglasses, sports and youth and school activities, and many other worthy causes.

There is a long history of military service from these small valley towns and a deep appreciation for those that serve in the military. Caruthers has the distinction of two Congressional Medal of Honor recipients listed at the top of its Veterans Memorial located at the edge of town. Listed below these two heroes are the names of thousands of other veterans that have served their country. The Lemoore Naval Air Station, the largest air base on the west coast, is only ten miles south of Riverdale and its influence is felt and appreciated by the community. Easton, the town closest to Fresno, has a large veteran population always ready to help where needed. By combining their strengths, the three Lions Clubs felt they could do the most good in giving back to those who have given so much.

While always supportive of the efforts of each other clubs, the Caruthers, Easton and Riverdale Lions did not have a history of working together on shared activities. To succeed in this effort, a steering committee was formed with representatives from each club. Goals were set, responsibilities divided, and the work began. All along, the goal was to sell 750 tickets at \$50 per person. Salute Our Wounded Heroes quickly sold out, without any media advertising. The event was held at the Caruthers Fair Grounds in the new livestock building recently built by the efforts of a yearly fundraiser spearheaded by the Caruthers Lions Club. Sponsorships were sold at the Purple Heart level for \$5,000, the Silver Star level for \$2,500, and the Bronze Star level for 1,000. Close to \$35,000 alone was raised by the generous support of sponsors and donors and the live and silent auctions brought in an additional \$34,000. One generous community member gave \$10,000 after listening to the speech delivered by wounded Green Beret Shane Gandy, the keynote speaker. Cadets from neighboring Selma High School Marine ROTC program provided help with parking, seating and the serving of dessert. The Chamber Ensemble Choir from nearby Immanuel High School sang before and during dinner and sang an absolutely beautiful rendition of our National Anthem.

The Caruthers, Easton and Riverdale Lions Clubs and the surrounding communities are proud to have worked together in Saluting Our Wounded Heroes. The spirit of Lionism and patriotism are alive and well in the Central San Joaquin Valley and are proof of what can be accomplished by good people with a shared belief and a common set of goals.





Leo Club Fun Day

Brentlinger Park was the site of the recent Leo Club Fun Day sponsored by Central Valley Lioness Lions Club and Parlier Lions Club. Forty members, ages 12-18, from Selma, Parlier, Riverdale and McFarland Leo Clubs got to know each other through mixer activities, organized games, self defense moves taught by Will Cho and a barbecue. During lunch each club held introductions and highlighted their community service, activities and fund raisers. There are more than 150,000 Leos in 6,000 clubs in 139 countries. Each club is sponsored by a Lions Club. Leos focus on individual and social development, leadership skills and community service. The name “Leo” is an acronym for leadership, experience and opportunity.

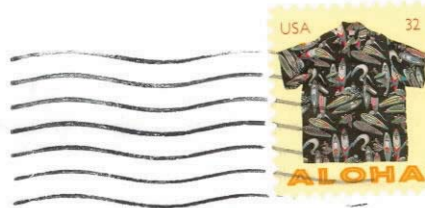
