To the great Lions of District 4-A2. The new Lions' year got off to a great start with our first District meeting in Lemoore, July 30^{th} and 31^{st} . Much thanks to the Lemoore Lions for preparing and serving dinner on Friday night. Also, to the Hanford Breakfast Lions for preparing and serving breakfast and lunch on Saturday (plus some of the Lemoore Lions who also helped



on Saturday). We had over 90 people for dinner and over 100 for each of the Saturday meals. Friday evening was the Installation of the Cabinet officers, done excellently by PIP Bill Biggs. Saturday was the business meeting part, and two guest speakers (visiting DG Marcia Newyear of L-1 and PDG Bill Newyear).

This wasn't easy to decide, but I believe we will try this newsletter being distributed electronically. I would ask club members to please print a

copy for those who don't have access to the web-site, particularly if that happens to be your president and/or secretary. We will see how this works and make changes the next time if we need to.

As I write this article, I have visited 6 Lions clubs. I have 38 scheduled, 2 partly scheduled (definite date not set yet, but January or later), 14 still to be scheduled, plus one club I did their Installation in June that they said I could consider my official visit. It has been great so far, my biggest regret is Lion David has been unable to go with me because of his afternoon work schedule. I look forward to the rest of the visits and do hope I can at least get them all scheduled soon, even if the visit isn't until sometime in 2011.

Before our next District meeting, Lion David and I will have gone to the USA/Canada Leadership Forum in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. I am excited that we have many from A-2 that will also be there.

Some of the rest of our events are: New Members Night on October 21^{st} in Caruthers. I hope as many of our new members (from last October) will be able to attend and be recognized; the 2^{nd} District/Cabinet meeting on November 5^{th} & 6^{th} in Visalia at the Lampliter (the registration form has been e-mailed out to several people, and is available on our District web site); the 3^{rd} District/Cabinet meeting on February 25^{th} and 26^{th} in Dinuba. The District Convention will be May 13^{th} to 15^{th} , at the Radisson in Fresno.

We all have a lot of work to do to keep our District strong. Yes, we do need to bring in new members. But, we also have to work hard on keeping the members we have. We have to make them feel like they are needed and vital to their Lion's club. We have two great Vice-District Governors and a great MERL team to help if you want them.

Thank You to Lion Ben Fregoso, for his excellent work doing the Registration forms for our District meetings. A very big Thank You to Lion Shirley Welch for all her hard work in selling Directory ads. She did an incredible job selling so many ads. Also, Thank You to Lion Jim Copner for his outstanding work with our District Newsletters, District Directory, and our District web-site. This very hard-working Lion has been doing a lot of work in these three areas for at least four years now.

From the District 4-A2 Cabinet Secretary:

Greetings to all the Lions of District 4-A2! Many clubs reduced their activities during the summer months to give everyone a well deserved break from their hectic schedules. I hope everyone had an enjoyable summer and is ready to hit the ground running for the remainder of the Lion Year 2010-2011. Opportunities abound for our District 4-A2 Lions Clubs to truly make a difference in our communities, our valley, and our nation and around world.

After this brief pause for rest, it is important for clubs to ramp up quickly on the activity level—both in fund raisers and service projects. A very active club leads to energized members who are excited about what their club is doing. Not only does it energize your members, it opens up great opportunities to recruit new members into your club. As I said in my first article, there is no better advertisement for Lionism than to see dedicated, hard-working Lions performing community service projects for their local towns and schools. Also, don't accept status quo—we will never grow without pushing our boundaries and stepping out into new projects and activities. Let's strive to make this a banner year for Lionism in 2010-2011.

In reviewing the reports for the District, two areas are immediately highlighted that we need to be aware of. The first is critical for our Clubs and District. In the first two full reporting months (Jul/Aug) and the reports received thus far for Sep, our gain versus loss in our membership is troubling. Gains (New, Transfer, and Reinstated) total 35 members, which are good for the 1st Qtr, but our Losses, are almost double at 66 members. This roughly equates to a loss of 2 Lions for every new Lion we bring in. Active and robust recruiting efforts by the Membership Chairman/Committee are the lifeblood for the local clubs. Without growth our clubs will stagnate and eventually die. Lions Clubs are too important to our communities to allow this to happen. It is incumbent upon each and every Lion to constantly be alert for opportunities to invite an individual to become a member of the world's greatest service organization. Secondly, the information noted above is based upon data available to me from the membership reports submitted to LCI. Our submission rate for the District is standing at about 49% of the clubs submitting reports, which means that the trends

noted above could be somewhat more encouraging or much worse if we had more complete data to analyze. Either way, the trend for the District is not going in the right direction.

Our second Cabinet Meeting will be held in Visalia, Ca. on November 5-6. If you missed the first Cabinet Meeting, please make every effort to have your club represented. Your participation is what makes our District Meetings great.

Let's Go To Ensenada!

The Visitation Committee was just down there the last weekend in August, beginning preparations for next March. The Ensenada Lions were as friendly as ever, and we were treated to a lot of good food, great information and lots of laughs. We went down there to discuss ideas and brainstorm efforts to make next year's visitation another success.

What is Operation Friendship? It is an annual trip to Ensenada held each March. What began as a small group of Lions driving down together and creating bonds with the Leones de Ensenada has become an official visitation with thousands of dollars in donations and countless pairs of glasses distributed to children in some

of the rural school areas around the City. Over the years, various school sites have been selected as the recipient of donations and some schools have literally grown from nothing to formal school sites, with the help of the Lions. Presently, money is raised for targeted schools, Lion Dr. Jeff Garcia (Lemoore Lions) conducts eye exams and distributes eyeglasses, while Lion Sophia Aguilar (Lemoore Lions) provides dental cleanings and supplies tooth brushes to all the children at the school site. Also, in years past, any adults who live in the surrounding rural areas have

also been provided vision treatment. Additionally, a formal Lion meeting is held on Saturday and any monies or donations presented as part of the project are identified by club. There is traditionally a guest speaker or the President of the Ensenada Lions, who addresses the group. The history of the project and examples of its accomplishments are usually mentioned during the meeting; it can be very eye-opening when you hear how much our help through this project has impacted others.

There are some additional things in the works right now. We discussed sites and visited a new school while we were there. We also went over some potential fundraisers. Each of the committee members has a DVD, with pictures and information from prior Ensenada visitations. If your club is interested, please contact one of them and arrange for a presentation at your club's meeting.

The Committee is getting excited about next March; we hope that each of you is able

"Hands Across the Border"

This year Lions District 4-A2 and District 4-C1 will be participation the 47th annual "Operation Friendship Visitation" also known as "Hands Across the Border" to the Ensenada Lions in District B-1.hands

"The purpose of this visitation shall be for the Lions of California and the Lions of Ensenada, Baja California to work together under the banner "We Serve" in helping the people in and around Ensenada with services that Lions working together are able to provide.

The "Operation Friendship Visitation" shall be a voluntary visit of Lion members from various clubs and districts. The visitation shall be self supporting with each attending, paying their own expense.



The only revenue source shall be from the sale of raffle tickets, and these funds shall be held by the Ensenada Lions Club to be used for the "School Build ing Fund". The operation Friendship committee shall be responsible for paying any and all of their personal expenses."



"The visitation shall be a group of Lion members from California and Mexico, meeting and working together for the betterment of Lions.

(item) 4. An additional project will be in the area of vision. This will include eye glasses and vision exams furnished for the Ensenada and/or other areas."

The main project for the visitation is to build & furnish schools in the Ensenada area and/or any area of Baja Mexico; our vision clinics are held at the school site(s). The schools to date all have been for elementary grades, children from 4 years to about 12 years old.

For the past 11 years, Dr. Jeff Garcia (Lemoore Lions Club) has served as the lead Optometrist and some years he has had assistance from PDG Dr. Andy Zografos (District 4-C1) and Dr. Lou Blechman (District 4-A2, Visalia Breakfast Lions).

This next visitation, March 17 – 20, 2011, we will be visiting two (2) school sites.

I am asking our clubs in our district to try to collect as many children's glasses as we can. Please ask your family members, your neighbors, people at your work place and church for these much needed glasses. Children's glasses placed in a dresser drawer or night stand are most of the time obsolete when new prescriptions are written by your optometrist.

We need approximately 800 pairs of children's glasses. It is very important to us to continue to serve the children in this region of Ensenada. We have made a huge impact in this area, and each year when we return for our annual visitation, we witness our dedication and see for ourselves all the progress that we the Lions of 4-A2 have made in the schools and how we have changed the lives of these children.



Our district Ensenada Friendship Committee members will truly appreciate your help in reaching our goal of 800 pairs of children's glasses so that we can continue in helping the people in and around Ensenada with services that Lions working together are able to provide.

As you collect and sort your clubs' glasses, place the children's glasses in a separate box or bag and label "Ensenada"; give to Lion Lillette or Dr. Jeff Garcia. We will be at all cabinet meetings and at our New Members' recognition night in Caruthers. If you have any questions, please ask any committee member or either Dr. Jeff or Lion Lillette.


