

"Lions are the Light of World"

Do you ever wonder if your service to others is making an impact? Is it enough? The prescription glasses given to a needy child, is it making a difference in his life?

I recently watched the movie, "The Miracle Worker." The talented Anne Bancroft played Annie Sullivan and a young Patty Duke, Helen Keller, I was stunned to learn how true this performance stayed to true life facts. In the days after, I researched Annie Sullivan's life. It wasn't a pretty picture. Born into extreme poverty, Annie was left almost completely blind at the tender age of 5 from untreated trachoma. When her mother died two years later, her alcoholic father sent her and her younger brother Jimmie, who had a tubercular hip, to Tewksbury orphanage. This was a deplorable institution. Child predators, criminals, the insane, many with incurable diseases roamed the halls. Annie's beloved brother Jimmie only lasted three months before dying there. In her autobiography she remembers waking up in the middle of the night to find his bed gone. She ran to the "dead house" to find his cold little body under a dirty sheet. "Jimmie was all I had and I sobbed for days on end but there was no-one to console me", she writes.

A few more years passed and then a bright ray of hope presented itself. Annie implored a state official who was visiting Tewksbury to help her, saying to him, "I want to go to school!" The official did help her and within several weeks Annie was released from Tewksbury and went on to study and live at The Perkins School for the Blind. Annie's formal education had finally begun and she flourished under the guidance of her teachers. Annie was smart and quickly learned what is called the manual alphabet developed for deaf people. Each letter of the alphabet is formed with a different hand sign.

For a person who is deaf-blind, words are signed into the palm of the hand where the movements of the fingers can be felt.

This learning proved invaluable later on in communicating with Helen Keller.

Annie graduated Perkins School as Valedictorian of her class.

I encourage my Lion family to go online and hear her speech... I wept to read it.


Not long after this, a letter arrived at Perkins School.

it was from Mr. and Mrs. Keller... (The original letter can be viewed online.) They needed a governess and teacher for their 7 year old daughter Helen.

Helen was deaf, blind and mute. Born into a privileged background with parents whom, out of pity for her condition, and to "keep the peace" indulged Helen with every wish and whim she fancied. They did not know how to control nor reach her so they just gave in

The consequences of their indulgence was that Helen had become uncontrollable and when she didn't get her way all hell broke loose.

I am not going to go further into what happens

odds. I encourage Leos and Lions everywhere who haven't seen this film to watch it!

Annie Sullivan. partially blind herself, but with the heart of a Lion reached down into that child's world and pulled her out of her locked, dark, silent existence. Her letters during this time to her teachers back home at Perkins School show her struggles as she says "I cannot teach her until she learns to obey me, she must be completely dependant on me, even for the very air she breathes."

Well, the break through for Helen did come in a startling revelation of understanding that exploded Helen's world, piercing the blackness and the

silence forever . Under the lifelong tutelage of Annie Sullivan, Helen Keller went on to graduate from *Radcliff College* and become one of the most renowned advocates for the blind this world has ever seen. She radically changed the direction of Lionism forever as she implored the men at the Lions International Convention in 1925 to become "Knights of the Blind" in the crusade against darkness. She rocked the world Lions! How many lives have been changed because of what she began? But lets not forget that it could not have happened without an Annie Sullivan .

When we give to another human being the tools they need to reach their full potential, miracles happen! The recipient of our service becomes the giver. No contribution, no service, however small, is returned to us empty. The goodness that we give out to the world comes back one hundred times over and in ways which we may never know.

Did Annie Sullivan know when she reached down into that dark, silent world that there was a "Helen Keller" at the other end? That in some strange way, Annie's unimaginable sufferings in her early years created a depth of understanding that could reach this imprisoned child like no one else could?

In the same way my friends, the prescription glasses placed on the face of that precious child may belong to the next scientist who will

Fellow "Lions, Lioness & Leos" of District 4-A2

A lot of water has run under the preverbal bridge since our last newsletter, a Council of Governors' (COG) Meeting in San Jose, the Lions International Convention in Seattle, our District Installation Cobinet Meeting the COG Meeting in Agra-

tion Cabinet Meeting, the COG Meeting in Agora Hills, Governor George's initial club visits, etc.

The International Convention was my first and a real eye opener for me. I am not sure how many Lions from around the world attended the convention but I have heard estimates in excess of 13,000 with more than 3,000 that marched in the Lion's Parade. The local residents lined the streets and expressed their thanks to the passing Lions for visiting their city.

The convention offered opportunities to meet lions from all over the world, for pin trading, purchasing Lion merchandise from the Lion's Foundation and other vendors, attend training forums on a variety of subjects and to share some excellent food. The most rewarding experience was to hear IPIP Eberhard Wirfs, IP Sid Scruggs and our newly elected IP Dr. Wing Kun-Tam speak, offering their great visions of Lionism. Our new President spon-

sored one of the scheduled speakers into Lionism; this new member also became a Melvin Jones Fellow at the time of his induction.

The election of the 2011-2012 International Officers went as expected. The increase in the International dues of \$2.00 in 2012 and another \$2.00 in 2013 passed with the first increase to commence January 1, 2012.

The other matters up for a vote were the bylaw revisions assigning membership responsibilities to the 1st VDG and Leadership responsibilities to the 2nd VDG, both revisions passed. I recommend that every Lion take the opportunity to attend at least one convention before they retire from Lions. Governor George made a commitment to IP Dr Wing Kun-Tam that District 4-A2 would plant 2000 trees this year that is basically 1 tree per member. We need to support our Governor and see that is his promise is fulfilled.

The COG meeting in Agora Hills was a time for some forward planning, getting better acquainted with the new Council Chairperson (Richard Wilmot), some extensive training on membership development from the new MD-4 GMT group and recognizing new chairpersons and members elected to other MD-4 committees, etc.

The sitting District Governors selected the 2012 Student Speakers Contest subject which is "What Could the America of Yesterday Teach the America of Tomorrow?" The Governors recognized that LCIF receives more publicity from the Lion Rose Parade float than any other endeavor. Their theme this year is "A World at Peace", which would be something truly great. After viewing the renderings depicting the float, I think it will be one of best we have had. We had a lot of fun last year on our District 4-A2 float decorating day trip. From atop the 10ft scaffold, I decorated a portion of the Lion's head and face. Every Lions Club with a Leo group should consider bringing the Districts Leos together and plan a similar trip this year. If you are interested contact the

District Leo Development Chairperson, Phil Gant @ 559.229.3407, and he will work with you to make it happen.

The District Officer Installation and first Cabinet Meeting went well thanks to the Lemoore Lions Club and the Hanford Breakfast Club, we had 127 plus registered guests and some really great food. It was great to see a lot of lions that we have not seen

for a while including our Installing Officer, the Honorable Fred Dupras with his wife Lion Pam. It was great to see the first timers as well; our new lions are our tomorrow. Governor George continues to receive comments from attendees saying they had fun and are looking forward to the next meeting. We hope that our future endeavors this year are both fun and educational. If you have any ideas that would help us accomplish this goal, call or email George or me.

We have two District events on the horizon, the *New Member's Night* and the Governor's *second Cabinet Meeting*. Unfortunately, due to scheduling issues they are back to back. *New Member's Night* will be in Dinuba on October 20th followed by the district meeting in Porterville on October 21 -22. We understand that it is a little much but both are important for different reasons. Therefore, we ask that you consider the

following, then attending both events. *Dinuba Lions Club* was the host for one of our district meetings last year; it was well done and the food was outstanding. *New Member's Night* is a time set aside to recognize and show our appreciation to those who have signed on to take us into the future. Further, the sponsors should receive our appreciation as well for their new member development efforts. The attendees are introduced to a great number of lions outside the one Club scenario, which arguably aids in their development and also improves our retention opportunities. Every club with a new member(s) should consider sponsoring each new member, their sponsor and the Club's President at this annual event.

The Cabinet Meeting is a must; a mini forum will replace some of the regular reports. The forum will include *Global Leadership Team (GLT)* training and *Global Membership Team (GMT)* training. Most clubs within the district are losing members and we need to make the effort to turn the corner and grow our clubs.

There are a number of clubs that never change their officers because no one wants to lead. The GLT will assist you with identifying potential leaders and help you develop them.

I saved the best for my last appeal for your attendance. The *Porterville Breakfast Lions Club* took the lead in hosting the meeting which will be held at the *Nuckols Ranch* in Porterville. A very nice dinner is planned for Friday the 21st following a no host cocktail hour. You will be entertained by the school's string band before and during your dinner followed by a short meeting.

Governor George and I are serious about Lion/District business but we see no reason not to have fun while we are doing it.

One last thought, we need your email address to deliver the newsletter; you are reminded that it is planned for the hard copy of the newsletter to be phased out by year end.

PORTERVILLE BREAKFAST FUND RAISER PROJECTS

Traditionally the club held a White Cane Day the first Friday of October.

This year we are attempting to replace "White Cane Day" with three new events specifically dedicated to Sight Conservation. A "Drive-through Dinner" on October 13, a spring "Swing for Sight" golf event on April 13, and a beer booth at the city sponsored Freedom Fest fireworks display on June 30. For the past six years White Cane Day has netted: \$1,112, \$1,135, \$1,859, \$2,140, \$2,071, and \$1,963. We have no history for the three we are starting this year.



Cioppino Dinner has been a "Backbone" fundraiser for 20+ years, held on the last Sat of January. We prepare a heavy tomato base sauce that is poured over fish, crab, scallops, and shrimp served with bread, salad and wine. Raffle prizes and auction items make the evening a community social event.

Our proceeds over the past six years from this event are: \$6,970, \$8,210, \$8,500 \$5,900, \$6,590, \$8,310
