Fellow Lions, Lioness and Leos of District 4-A2,

We just finished a tremendous year for membership growth. We offer our special thanks to the 30 clubs that ended the year with a positive growth of one or more members. We also recognize and appreciate the clubs that had no change in their membership numbers which means you kept your friends in your Lion family. To the clubs experienced a net membership losses we offer our assistance to reverse your trends. LCI membership leaders teach that you can't grow membership in a district without chartering one or two new clubs. I don't think they were talking about District 4-A2, our year was exceptional, we were +71 members without a new club. We added 20 members with the chartering of the Sanger Club in June. Our final number was +91 members, which was 3rd best in MD-4. I believe that we can do better than 3rd.

The membership growth leaders for the year were: 4th place tie Fresno Diwata and Fresno North with +10; 3rd place, Richgrove at +11; 2nd place,

Laton at +13; for the 2014-2015 year with the most membership growth was Buttonwillow with +16. You all are awe-some! The Membership Growth Trophy has created some excitement and contributed greatly to our success this year. My club, Ponderosa, added 7 new members trying to earn a spot on the trophy but fell short, maybe this year. We had four different quarterly winners last year; Diwata, Richgrove, Buttonwillow and the Pixley Lions won the last quarter. There are five opportunities to add your club name to the trophy, win one of the four quarter or have the best total gain for the year. Our best success last year and I am proud of the five clubs that started the year with their membership totals in the mid teens and finished in the mid 20s. Fresno Pride, Parlier, Richgrove, McFarland and Pixley can now better serve their respective communities.

At the end of August the District is -6 for the year with only 10 clubs that have positive membership growth. We have a three way for first place with 3 each: Clovis, Reedley and Selma Central Valley Lioness Lions. Your September success or short fall will dictate the winning club. It is great to see that Clovis is beginning to grow again and Fresno Unlimited is + 2 members already, awesome!

"Ask 1" is still our challenge this year but I have seen it written with a word added "Ask One Today" This challenge added to our success last year, let's have all of our 63 Clubs meet the challenge this year. I am positive that if we do, the District will end the year in first place in MD-4 and maybe even the leader in the USA.

This is our Centennial Year which offers all of us some tremendous opportunities which includes increasing our ability to serve our communities by increasing our membership in our clubs as well as the district. This year our new member pin will have the word Centennial making it more desirable and the member sponsor will receive the awesome Centennial Sponsor pin. Special Banner Patches, more media attention, etc.. Take advantage of the extra tools. Remember, we are to focus on Protecting our EVNIRONMENT, Relieving the HUNGER, Sharing the VISION, and Engaging our YOUTH. When you record these activities note the number of people affected by your efforts.

I am still offering my 'Just ask' membership recruitment workshop for multiple or individual Clubs. The training will include a review of all current membership programs i.e., Student programs, Family , Veterans, etc. if you want to grow "Just Ask"

I have tremendous respect for our new Governor, Craig Cooper, I believe that he truly has a Lion Heart. There doesn't appear to be any fluff, just a straight forward honest and caring approach to all that he does. Let's make his year better than our last.

Membership Growth Trophy

The new Membership Growth recognition trophy was unveiled at the second Cabinet Meeting in Lemoore. The Lion that stands on the top of the trophy came from Pennsylvania, the base was made by an Auberry, CA cabinet maker so we can safely say it is a "one of a kind" trophy. It is a three year trophy that offers 15 opportunities for your club to be recognized by having the highest net gain in membership for a quarter or the highest total net gain for the year. The trophy will be presented to the winning club at the first Cabinet Meeting or Convention following the close of the quarter and the winning club is identified. Each quarterly winner will retain the trophy until it is time for it to be update for the next recipient. The club who's name appears on the trophy the most during the three year contest will keep the trophy for all to see when you visit their club.

Contest rules are as follows:

Participating clubs must be in good standing with Lions Clubs International.

Membership results must be positive: example a) previous results -2 members, current quarter net +3 members equals + 1 for the quarter; example b) previous results +10 members, current quarter net +3 members equals +3 for the quarter.

The minimum requirement; the club's membership net total must exceed the membership numbers record on the last day of the previous year and must increase by 1 member during the contest quarter.

There will be 12 quarterly winners, the club with the highest net gain in membership for the quarter.

There will be 3 annual winners, the club that has the highest net gain in Membership for each year.

LCI, MD-4 & District 4-A2 dues for the new member must be paid.

The trophy must be returned in the same condition as it was when you took possession.

Branch Club members are included in parent club totals.

New Clubs do not qualify for this award their Charter year.

There are two primary components of membership growth, the first is member retention, keep the members that you have. There are always recognizable signs that indicates a member is less than excited about being a Lion, i.e., he or she stops attending meetings or club events, slow to pay dues, nonparticipant during meetings, becomes antisocial, etc. Sometimes it is easier to retain one rather than find one. Second, "Ask One", new members are out there, we just need to invite them to join a club that they find attractive and is doing the things that they want to be associated with.

There is an easy formula to win your club name plate on the trophy; Retain Members + Add New Members = growth. I am always available to assist you with planning and conducting membership drives.

Congratulations to our first club to receive this recognition; the Fresno Diwata Lions Club. They recorded a net gain of 12 members during the first quarter of year 2014-2015. Awesome!

The Lions even helped us learn brail, so when I found out the Lions wanted me to perform for them I just couldn't say no!

I started playing music when I was 5 or 6. I played all around the bay area for 20 years. The music scene in the bay area slowed down, so I started selling cars in 1983. The cost of living in the bay area, along with raising three kids, took a toll on us. My wife Lorrie was working, and I worked 2 jobs, so my wife and I moved to Bakersfield in 1988, and I have been playing music here ever since. Once the music slowed down again, I started selling cars for a local dealer in 1996. Our kids are grown up now, and we have 5 grand-kids. My wife still likes me after all these years. I think we have a good life. I still enjoy playing music very much; it's a blast!

Country George will be performing on Friday night at our 2nd District 4-A2 Cabinet meeting in Bakersfield on October 30, 2015. We hope to see you all there to enjoy great music with a man who was personally touched by the Lions so many years ago!


July 6, 1941 — September 21, 2015
