

Thanks Lion Jim, for all that you do. Outstanding job.



### Multiple District 4 2010-11 Final Results

WINS CALIFORNIA STATE WIDE COMPETITION IN ANNUAL LIONS INTERNATIONAL
PEACE POSTER CONTEST



December 8, 2010 – Esther (Hyo Jin) Kim, an 8TH grade student at Parks Jr. High School in Fullerton, CA, sponsored by District 4L-4, won the California State contest held at Multiple District Four headquarters in Santa Barbara on Wednesday, December 8, 2010. Her poster was judged best of 15 first place posters from each of the Lions Districts in California. "No fight, no sorrow, no hatred, just a quiet happiness..." the 13-year-old from Fullerton quoted for her poster.

The Lions of California are appreciative to four judges from the Santa Barbara area who selected the winning poster. They were Helene Schneider, mayor of Santa Barbara; Tina Villadolid, artist and lead teacher and coordinator of community art programs for the Santa Barbara Museum of Art, Peter Omoregie, vice region leader of the SGI-USA (Soka Gaki International, world-wide peace movement.) as well as technical director at Cyber & Network Information Integrity and Michael Todd, editor of the online magazine Miller-McCune.com. They judged the posters based upon the criteria of originality, artistic merit and portrayal of the contest theme, "Vision of Peace."

Multiple District Four's Council Chairperson Larry Dicus said he was impressed by the expression and creativity of the students of California. "It is obvious that these young people have strong ideas about what peace means to them. I'm so proud that we were able to provide them with the opportunity to share their visions." Ms. Kim's poster first won the local competition of 35 entries, sponsored by the Fullerton Lions Breakfast Club, President Walter Rountree. Her poster was then submitted to District Governor Norm MacKenzie of District 4-L4 where it again placed first out of the club level winning posters.

Esther Kim's poster will now be submitted to Lions Clubs International Headquarters in Chicago to be entered into the international competition where her poster will be among more than an expected 350,000 entries submitted worldwide to compete for the grand prize.

## District 4-A2 PEACE POSTER CONTEST 2010-11 Final Results

WINS FIRST PRIZE IN DISTRICT 4-A2 CONTEST



The judging was held in Armona on November 20th and conducted by a Lion who is a professional artist (graphic design) and a youth art specialist recommended by the Kings Art Center in Hanford.

The judges commended all entries on good originality and the top two on strong symbolism. They picked a winner as requested, but also recommended recognition for a second place poster they thought noteworthy. The district received six posters from three clubs this year.

The District 4-A2 winner for 2010-11 is Brittany Elsome, a 7th grader at Pioneer Middle School in Hanford. Her teacher is Mrs. Heather Barrentine, and hers was one of 21 posters from that school. The contest at Pioneer was sponsored by the Hanford Breakfast Lions Club, which also sponsored the Peace Poster contest at JFK Middle School and Kings River-Hardwick School in the Hanford area.

The second place poster was created by Joe De Los Santos, a 7th grader at Cuyama Elementary, sponsored by the Midway-Sunset Lions Club of Taft. The Midway-Sunset Lions also sponsored contests at Maricopa Elementary and Lincoln Elementary.



Lion Keith Hargrave became a Lion on October 27, 1959, as a Charter Member of the Fresno Breakfast Lions. His Father, Herbert Hargrave, who was a Charter Member of the Fresno Lions Club (October 9, 1920) introduced Keith to Lionism and because they worked for the same company it was decided that Keith should join the Fresno Breakfast Lions Club which his Father, Keith Hargrave, helped establish and charter. Lion Keith faithfully served the Fresno Breakfast Lions Club for the next 20 years, serving as Club Secretary, Board Member, numerous committee chairs.

In 1979, Herbert Hargrave, who was the only Club Secretary that the Fresno Lions Club ever had, became very ill and on April 1 of that year, Lion Keith transferred from the Fresno Breakfast Lions Club to the Fresno Lions Club to replace his Father as Club Secretary. Lion Keith served the Fresno Lions Club, later renamed the Fresno Host Lions Club from, April 1, 1979 until June 30, 2008 another 29 years as Club Secretary for a total of 49 years as a Club Secretary with the two Clubs.

Lion Keith chaired many projects and events for both Clubs from the beginning and remains an active member of the Fresno Host Lions Club today. He was a member of each Club's Board of Directors for a continuous 49 years and continued as a Board Member of the Fresno Host Lions Club until June 30, 2009. In addition, Lion Keith was very active in District 4-A2 affairs and religiously attended every District, Cabinet and Zone meeting conducted. Lion Keith also maintained a 100% attendance record as a member of the Fresno Host Lions Club, an amazing accomplishment because the Club has met weekly since its inception and continues to do so today.

Lion Keith helped the Fresno Host Lions Club sponsor several new Lions Club into existence over the years. He also assisted, supported and taught 29 Fresno Host Presidents as Club Secretary and he guided many new members to become more involved in Club/District projects and events. He is a Leader who not only talks the talk, but walks the walk.

The trip is scheduled for March 17-20, 2011. The good news....the registration prices and hotel costs will remain THE SAME AS LAST YEAR. The registration is \$75 and the room costs depend on guest and bed selection, and are broken down in the registration form found in this newsletter, but all remain the same. The registration is also available online at the MD-4 website. There was one increase, for those that ride the bus, the fee will be \$150. That is a slight increase, but still a fair price, considering the excellent service we have received from the current bus company.

The Visitation Committee returned to Ensenada in November and sealed all the deals and signed all the contracts. We were concerned about prices, especially since there hasn't been a major change in quite some time. The Ensenada Lions were just as concerned with the cost of the visitation as our Committee and we did our best to reach 'no change' status.

So what is on the agenda this year? Sign up and you will see when you get there....just kidding.

We will be visiting a school within Ensenada city limits this year, the Primary School -Mariano Sanchez Carrera-Jesus Olvera Gonzalez, it is a school who's Lion ties go back more than 25 years, as it was Lion assistance that first helped build the site. Along with financial support for some of the school's needs, one of the goals is to provide many children with both eye and dental services. For those that have been there before, you know that Lion Dr. Jeff Garcia (Lemoore Lions) and Lion Sophia Aguilar (Lemoore Lions) will need your help to get things done. For those that have never been there before, Lion Jeff performs eye exams and Lion Sophia performs dental cleanings. As part of the school site visitation, hundreds of children, along with adults, will receive these services. For some, it will be the first time in their life. If you get asked for help by either of them, please say yes. Trust me, it can be very humbling to those of us who have always been blessed with so much.

Friday night's theme is Costume Night. What does that mean? I really don't know, this one was Lion Ben Ferguson's (Parlier Lions) idea. Be warned, if Lion Ben plans it, I know it will be a good time. In years past, we have had things like Mardi Gras and Western theme and we have gotten great participation from everyone. When I asked Lion Ben what we should wear, he laughed and said, "anything you want!" So I expect to see costumes of all kinds at the dinner dance.

Please find it in your heart to purchase some, every ticket sold helps the cause. In February, we will also have raffle tickets available at the cabinet meeting in Dinuba.

I asked you in the last newsletter...have you started packing? Have you gotten your passport? Have you invited and encouraged some of your fellow club members to join you? Have you invited a guest/prospective Lion (this trip has facilitated many Lion memberships over the years). You have two months left to get started. I have never met a single Lion, Lioness or guest that regretted making the trip. I know you will have a great time and the sight of the kids benefitting from our efforts will be more than reward itself


