

We have completed the fifth month of our 2012-2013 Governor year. We have had some tremendous successes and I greatly appreciation the effort that you all have put forth that created our positive results. We began the year as the number 1 District in MD-4 (California) for membership development. At the end of the first quarter (September 30th) we had fallen to 2nd and remained 2nd at the end of October. Membership continues to be one of our major challenges and a number of our clubs have stepped to the plate and hit some homeruns. East Bakersfield, Fresno Host, Visalia Charter Oaks, Visalia Sequoia and Visalia Sunset all have gained 3 members each. Hanford Breakfast, Orange Cove, Selma Central Valley and Visalia Breakfast have gained 2 members. The following clubs are positive one member Lem-

oore, McFarland, and SanJoaquin/Tranquility. We have 28 clubs that are reporting no change year to date and 15 others reporting net losses. If every club could reach the 10% gain challenge, it would produce a net gain of 193 members which would bring our total to 2129 members. Remember, if we think we can, are determined to do so and stay on track, I believe we will succeed.

The membership development leaders at the end of the first quarter Reedley, Coaling and Fresno Diwata were awarded the membership medallion for their efforts. Corcoran leads the District with 5 new member recorded during the first two months of the second quarter. There is still time to move your club up the ladder and earn your membership medallion.

It has been a pleasurable experience visiting our clubs, the Lions "We Serve" philosophy is evident in every club. As of the date of this writing, we have visited 42 clubs. We are hopeful that we will see most of the remaining 20 clubs by mid January which will offer us the opportunity to concentrate on our clubs that are in need of assistance with their membership challenges. The information that I review prior to visiting a club is membership development history, reporting history, club member rosters for e-mail addresses, etc. We have clubs that report monthly and timely; some that report membership numbers once annually and send no activity reports. It would be nice to see every club report both their member numbers and activities monthly. Reporting is the best way to communicate the status of your club and your successes. We have some clubs with only one e-mail listed, which means that we have clubs that will only receive one newsletter. Is it fair to our members to not allow them the opportunity to receive this publication? Lions Club Presidents/Secretaries, please print the "Club Roster with Addresses" take it to your meetings and/or events and have each member review their data for accuracy and have them provide their e-mail address.

Some of our club visitation attendees included Lion helpers and potential members. We have been successful converting potential Lions to members during visitation meetings. Please consider inviting individuals that you think would be an asset to your club and we may be helpful with your recruiting efforts.

The Convention registration is also included, we are going to Cambria. Plan for the "Food Fest" Friday night bring your club members with their best dish and take the crown from last year's winner. Make your reservations at the hotel early and send your registration form in as soon as possible so we can make the necessary plans to accommodate all attendees.

Thanks for being Lions and all the humanitarian things that you do for your respective communities. It is a real pleasure working with you all.

Earlier this month, the Caribbean and the East Coast of the United States were hit by Superstorm Sandy. I was saddened and deeply concerned when I heard of the storm's impact, but I also knew that Lions would be there to help. Not only are Lions on the ground, supporting each other and people in the affected communities, but Lions around the world are generously



providing donations to the disaster relief fund at Lions Clubs International Foundation. It is because of the disaster relief fund that LCIF could quickly respond to Superstorm Sandy, mobilizing US\$220,000 in grants for those in need. Lions were immediately able to put provided funds to use, delivering food, water, blankets and flashlights to those affected by the storm. Your donations to the disaster relief fund are MJF eligible and will support Superstorm Sandy victims in the coming weeks, unless a disaster of similar scope and scale requires Lions' immediate response.

In addition to disaster relief, Lions are able to make an impact in many other areas of service. Just look at our efforts to eliminate measles. We not only met the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation's challenge to raise US\$10 million for measles, we have exceeded it! This means even more children will be vaccinated, saving them from the harmful effects of measles. Congratulations, and thank you for your efforts. LCIF is working with the Measles Initiative and Gates Foundation to plan for the future.

I am inspired by all that Lions have accomplished through our Foundation. Together we save sight, provide disaster relief, support youth and meet humanitarian needs worldwide. Together we make a difference in millions of lives.
