OPERATION FRIENDSHIP

The 51st year of our District's Operation Friendship visitation took place March 21-24 in Ensenada, Mexico. It was another successful year and everyone in attendance had a great time. As you know, for 51 years now, Lions from our District have made the trip to Ensenada, Mexico and provided assistance and financial support for a multitude of school projects.

This year, the project location was a grade school in La Mision, Mexico. La Mision is located in a small valley approximately half-way between Tijuana and Ensenada. The school sits on a historical site as it shares ground with the original Mision San Miguel Arcangel built in the late 1700's; a fenced-off section protects the remaining portions of the mission's original adobe walls. Unfortunately, the school had fallen into some disrepair and two of the classrooms were actually condemned due to being unsafe to inhabit.

When the Committee visited Ensenada in November, this school site was selected for this year's project and work immediately began on repairing the school. Walls that had separated from the structure or cracked were rebuilt and new supports were added. The windows that had been broken and replaced with wood siding over the years were all fitted with new frames and glass. Rotted floors had new cement added to the foundation and tile was then laid in each of the condemned classrooms. Some of the other improvements included: new window screens, cement drainage around the building and the entire school was repainted.

Some of those updates sound pretty simple, but remember I said above that the school shares the location with a historical landmark? Some of the areas of improvement actually took place on portions of the historical sections of the property. This meant that something as simple as adding new screens to the windows required special permission to complete. In all, approximately \$5,000 worth of upgrades were completed at the school.

The Ensenada Lions are very proud of the progress and presented a slide show with before/after pictures of the site during our Saturday night formal visitation meeting.

Lemoore Lions Jeff Garcia and Sophia Aguilar did their usual great work and saw 130 children and 8 adults in both their Eye exam and dental cleaning clinics. The good news, overall, the children seemed healthier at this school than in some of our recent projects. There were fewer children who needed glasses. When I mention Lions Jeff and Sophia, by no means am I suggesting they work alone. There were at least 20 other Lions who helped each process along. This was definitely a team-effort!

Something that I thought was really amazing was the fact that Lion Jeff completed his eye exams in the future library for the school; Lion Sophia completed her dental cleanings in the future computer room of the school.

These two rooms were the places I saw boarded-up, with falling walls, as part of a condemned building just four months ago.

This year, after the trading pin auctions, raffle ticket sales and individual or club donations were counted, \$4,000 was raised. This money will help finish up the details at La Mision and then be used towards the next project site identified by our Committee and the Ensenada Lions.

Governor Dean Church joined us this year for his second visitation and he was kept busy at the school helping with the children in the dental exam room; he was also put to work at the Saturday formal meeting, installing three new Lions.

This year's excursion was a trip to La Buffadora (Blowhole). La Buffadora is approximately an hour's drive south of Ensenada and is one of three natural blowholes in the world. That is always a nice tourist stop for anyone that has never seen a blowhole, watching the ocean's force blast water straight up into the air. It was also a nice trip for those that hadn't been there in a few years, as they were pleasantly surprised at the improvements, including asphalt and cement walkways.

The trip was a fun time for all. Some helped with the clinic at the school, others helped cook the Saturday dinner at the Lion's Den and others just relaxed and took in the experience with their fellow Lions. If you haven't been there before or simply haven't joined us for a few years now, please consider going next year, mark your calendar, March 20-23, 2014.



Or, money can be added to what is already there so a Melvin Jones can be given. If you aren't sure if you have undesignated money amounts, and I haven't contacted you about it, please get in touch with me.

I hope as many of you as can, will attend our District Convention the first weekend of May. I will have a display and information on LCIF. There will be recognitions of Melvin Jones recipients at our Saturday lunch. If I am notified by any clubs that they have a MJF they would like to present at the Convention, then those will be presented then.



Proposed Amendments for 2013District 4-A2 Convention voting May 4, 2013

FIRST PROPOSED AMENDMENT: (Item 4. on your ballot)

Shall the District 4-A2 Constitution be amended to delete reference to the **District 4-A2 Mobile Screening Unit**, and renumber paragraphs accordingly?

Your Constitution & ByLaws Committee, (hereafter C&B), recommends a "yes" vote. *Background: The District no longer has a mobile screening unit, therefore no longer endorsesthe project, and the Foundation established to maintain and operate the unit has been dissolved.*

SECOND PROPOSED AMENDMENT: (Item 5. on your ballot)

Shall the District 4-A2 Constitution be amended to specify "**First** Vice-District Governor" in twelve places where that was intended, but the text presently says just "Vice-DistrictGovernor"?

Your C & B Committee recommends a "yes" vote. *Background: When Lions International recommended the position of Second Vice-DistrictGovernor, we added the position to our Constitution in 2010, but we have not yet redesignated theformer position of Vice-District Governor as First Vice-District Governor.*



THIRD PROPOSED AMENDMENT: (Item 6. on your ballot)

Shall the District 4-A2 Constitution be amended to add the District leaders and structure for Global Membership Team and Global Leadership Team, and to remove reference to Membership and Extension positions, and renumber paragraphs accordingly?

Your C & B Committee recommends a "yes" vote. *Background: This structure has been adopted and implemented by International and MD-4.* Approving this amendment will reconcile the GMT and GLT coordinator positions with our District 4-A2 procedures and budget.



FOURTH PROPOSED AMENDMENT: (**Item 7.** on your ballot)

Shall the District 4-A2 Constitution be amended to place the paragraph about Cat Havenunder Special Committees instead of Administrative Committees, and remove specificreference to the lion Cous-Cous?

Your C & B Committee recommends a "yes" vote.

Background: The duties of the Cat Haven Committee do not involve District administration. Cous-Cous, unfortunately, is dead.



FIFTH AND FINAL PROPOSED AMENDMENT: (Item 8. on your ballot)

Shall the District 4-A2 Constitution be amended to remove paragraph D of Section 6 of Article IX regarding the District Officers Training, and assign those duties to the new GlobalLeadership Team?

Your C & B Committee recommends a "yes" vote. *Background: The position that has been responsible for our annual School of Instruction for newclub officers becomes a part of the GLT anyway by* **Item 6**. We no longer need to specify aseparate committee to perform this duty.






