

Greetings to all of my fellow Lions in District 4-A2 and welcome to the new Lion Year 2018-2019

First of all, it is a great privilege to serve as your District Governor and I would like to thank everyone for their support over the past two years as I have been preparing to assume the responsibilities as District Governor. I look forward to an exciting year and will endeavor to enhance our District's outreach to those in need, both locally in our communities and throughout the world in partnership with LCIF.

Our goals as a District focus on four main areas, which I will briefly discuss:

Membership—one of the most vital aspects of club health is growth in membership. Without growth, clubs will stagnate and eventually close. Our goals are to open two new clubs with at least 20 members each and to focus on retaining our current members. This past year the District dropped 322 members and only added 209 members for a net loss of 113 members. We want to work with the clubs in attracting new members and just as important, retaining current members.

Leadership—identifying and training new leadership is very important for the success of the individual clubs and the District as a whole. There are multiple resources available for the individual Lions to learn new leadership skills. Effective leadership at the club level will help provide strong support to increase membership and expand service projects to the community.

<u>Service</u>—expanding our Lions presence in our communities will not only increase member satisfaction within the club, but also will be an avenue that can serve as a recruiting tool for new member prospects. People join Lions Clubs because they want to make a difference in their community. We have a lot room for improvement in this area and LCI is making great strides to improve the framework in which individual clubs can better serve their communities.

<u>LCIF</u>—this is our foundation for providing disaaster relief and support in five major areas of service—vision, hunger, environment, diabetes, and childhood cancer. Over the past few years, multiple disaster relief grants have been provided to the Lions Clubs of California to assist with the natural disasters we have faced, primarily from wildfires. Every cent that we give to LCIF goes to the area that is designated with no overhead costs. As I travel around the District on my club visits, I am going to challenge each Lion to become a personal supporter of LCIF. I believe in LCIF

and their mission and know that our dollars cannot be better spent on helping those in need around the world.

Again, I want to thank you for your support, and with your help we can make a difference in the world by living up to our motto "WE SERVE".

Membership, it's always on my mind and in my heart because it is what makes Lions Clubs International (LCI) the greatest Service organization in the World. None of our 63 clubs are any more special than another, the individual members by their actions make the difference. Members with that serving heart continue to grow their clubs to better serve their local community and beyond. Everything that happens in LCI begins at the club level. No members = no clubs = no LCI = a very large void in community service. New members all deserve a memorable induction into Lions, with the applicable pin(s), certificates, vests, etc, at the time they join the club. Followed quickly by an interesting new member orientation presented by a knowledgeable and well qualified leader. The new lion will also need a mentor, NO, not a sponsor, the mentor should be the most knowledgeable lion leader in the club that has a lion heart.

I do not like talking about last Year 2017-2018, it was not a 9-11 or Pearl Harbor but with respect to membership it was the biggest membership disaster I have witnessed in my 11 year Lion career. First we dropped two clubs with a combined membership total of 42 members that should have been dropped when they stopped meeting and closed their doors in the middle year 2016-2017. This was followed by 36 (58%) of our clubs experiencing a net loss in membership and another 10 clubs (15%) with a 0 net change. The bright spot, we had 17, (27%) of our clubs that gained membership. We chartered a new club, the Fresno Hispanic Lions Club, with 22 members. Their charter signing party is on August 11, 2018. We invite you all to attend, tickets are available through their club members, the Clovis Country Lions Club or myself. Governor Kevin reopened the Terra Bella Lions Club in June 2018 with 5 members, the club's name will be changed and it's contact address will also change.

The final quarter of 2017-2018 produced two new Lion Club names to be added to the Membership Trophy; Clovis Country Lions Club is the winner of the last quarter of 2017-2018 by dropping only one member and adding four new members for a net total of plus 3 members. Clovis Country Lions is also the Sponsoring Club for the new Fresno Hispanic Lions. The best Membership Growth club for 2017-2018 is the Parlier Lions Club with a net plus 7 members for the year. We offer our congratulations to the members of both clubs !!! We are offering a "Just Ask" Workshop in each Region this year, the scheduling has not been finalized. Your Region Chair will share the date, time and location with you when we are scheduled to be in your area. The workshop is a 4 step process that will change and grow your club.

This is a new year that offers us the chance to help a new Governor make a difference in our communities. Governor John's theme is "Lions are the Stars that Serve the World", the district goals that were established for the year are realistic and attainable. We need to ask ourselves, are we the "Stars" that will make a difference this year? I

know we can be, so let's get back on the "fast train" and help the Lion Stars shine bright over our communities.

Membership Growth Trophy

The new Membership Growth recognition trophy will be unveiled at the second District Meeting in Richgrove.



The Lion that stands on the top of the trophy is an 11" by 11" bronze and very proud Lion. The base was made by an Auberry, CA cabinet maker and given a furniture quality finish by Dean Church, so again we can safely say it is a "one of a kind" trophy. It is a three year trophy that offers 15 opportunities for your club to be recognized by having the highest net gain in membership for a quarter or the highest total net gain for the year. The trophy will be presented to the winning club at the first Cabinet Meeting or Convention following the close of the quarter and the winning club is identified. Each quarterly winner will retain the trophy until it is time for it to be update for the next recipient. The club who's name appears on the trophy the most during the three year contest will keep the trophy for all to see when you visit their club.

Contest rules are as follows:

- 1. Participating clubs must be in good standing with Lions Clubs International.
- 2. Membership results must be positive: example:
 a) previous results -2 members, current quarter net +3 members equals + 1 for the quarter.
 b) previous results +10 members, current quarter net +3 members equals +3 for the quarter.
- 3. The minimum requirement; the club's membership net total must exceed the membership numbers record on the last day of the previous year and must increase by 1 member during the contest quarter.
- 4. There will be 12 quarterly winners, the club with the highest net gain in membership for the quarter.
- 5. There will be 3 annual winners, the club that has the highest net gain in Membership for each year.
- 6. LCI, MD-4 & District 4-A2 dues for the new member must be paid.
- 7. The trophy must be returned in the same condition as it was when you took possession.
- 8. Branch Club members are included in parent club totals.
- 9. New Clubs do not qualify for this award their Charter year.

There are two primary components of membership growth, the first is member retention, keep the members that you have. There are always recognizable signs that indicates a member is less than excited about being a Lion, i.e., he or she stops attending meetings or club events, slow to pay dues, nonparticipant during meetings, becomes antisocial, etc. Sometimes it is easier to retain one rather than find one. Second, "Ask One", new members are out there, we just need to invite them to join a club that they find attractive and is doing the things that they want to be associated with. There is an easy formula to win your club name plate on the trophy;

RETAIN MEMBERS + ADD NEW MEMBERS = GROWTH
