Last October the **Kings** Lions Whiskey Tasting Fest raised \$8500. Are you going to do it again this year? The **Cutler-Orosi LEO**s were very involved in the Cinco de Mayo parade there. Their pizza sales brought in \$500.

Lion Manuel Gonzales had plastic to recycle and **Hanford Breakfast** President Emily Romero signed the club up for one bench in the district's Bags to Benches project for #2 and #4 polyethylene plastic. That's the stretchy plastic, not the crunchy plastic!
