History of the Salvation Army

William Booth, a minister in England, and his wife, Catherine, abandoned the traditional church pulpit in favor of taking the gospel of Jesus Christ directly to the people. He walked the streets of London, preaching to the poor, homeless, hungry, and destitute.

They began their unconventional ministry in 1865 and within 10 years the "Christian Mission" had over 1000 volunteers and evangelists. They were successful and converted over 250,000 thieves, prostitutes, gamblers, and drunkards to Christianity while serving their physical needs.

In 1878, Booth changed the name to the Salvation Army where it operates in over 100 countries worldwide today. Booth died in 1912 but his army of volunteers and wife Catherine and children carried on the mission.

Catherine Booth had no rights as a woman in that day and age nor ability to become a minister in any church, but was a passionate advocate for people in need. She believed that loving God meant loving people through action and her legacy of love, sacrifice, and service continues to shape the Salvation Army today.

Salvation Army also has a mission of disaster relief much like Lions International Foundation LCIF. They estimate that they help 800,000 individuals through earthquakes, tornados, wildfires, droughts, and floods every year.

Like LCIF, they have the highest rating from Charity Navigator and other rating services, as most of the money raised goes to helping others not salaries and administration.

Dec. 19: Latest News from Medical Ministries International MMI



Lion Ralph undated us on MMI's efforts and latest shipments. The most recent shipment was to Armenia. The Central Valley has many ties to Armenia through the many immigrants settling here. The latest shipment to Armenia was medical supplies and birthing tables to aid in safe delivery of infants. They sent eight 40' containers. They have completely supplied a surgery center and a new birthing center to a country that delivers 40 babies a day.

MMI received many significant donations from Armenian Americans in the Central Valley to fund the improvements. They completed a three week medical ministry trip with 30 members to provide medical care and get the new facilities set up. The group toured the Genocide Memorial in Yerevan.

Next shipment will be to Mongolia to the government-run health care services followed by another to Armenia, then to the Congo and Uganda. They are also planning to send supplies and manual beds to Ukraine as they are experiencing so many outages due to Russian bombing of hospitals and infrastructure.

Ralph is taking over as President of the Board and is very pleased with their fundraising and solvency during the pandemic. They have not had to touch their reserves and have been able to send many shipments of supplies to those in need around the world.

One goal they have is to consolidate their storage and facilities from 3 spread out buildings to one larger building to accommodate all their operations.
