Feb. 6: Annual Student Speakers Contest



Four Clovis West students participated in the annual MD-4 Student Speakers Contest. The topic was "Social Media, Connects Us or Isolates Us." Lion Larry Holody once again did an excellent job getting the participants and judges and conducting the contest! The judges were Pat Ogle, Terry Scambray and Danny Morris - all from different backgrounds and all had served previously. Great job again! NFL also had District visitors for the contest - Zone Chair, Kerri Holquin, Tony Reyes and Michael Gostanian from Clovis Country Lions, and Clovis West speech coach/teacher, Jennifer Oren and Administrator, Anisha Mayberry. As always, participants drew numbers to determine order of speaking. None of the speakers were identified until after the entire competition. As was true last year, all the speakers were from an AP Class for students seeking to become teachers using the topic as a class assignment. The top four speeches from the class competed at our student speakers' contest.

Speaker #1 was last year's winner, Zoe (Skylar) Lopez. Skylar wants to become a music teacher. She focused on the primary social Instagram, Facebook. media platforms, Snapchat, and Twitter first. All of these allow you to share as well as create content. She does not like the cyber bullying that goes on on these sites as they allow the person to remain anonymous. There are no consequences for the aggression and cruelty. She prefers Interpals and Discord, as you have more control over friends and messages you see. They allow connections with others you share friendship or interests with more personal control. She stated 70% of social media arose during the pandemic and did bring people together. Social media is good or bad depending on which sites and how you intend to use it.

Feb. 6 Annual Student Speakers Contest explored role of social media

Speaker #2 was Siena Bettini who is currently a junior and wants to attend Ohio State, majoring in Physical Education. Siena stated that 76% of users experience social fears, so the format of allowing likes and loves and comments in social media platforms releases dopamine and can create addictions just like the effect of gambling. As social media use increases, mental health issues increase. Greater use leads to greater unhappiness. Social media use was up by 80% in 2020 from before COVID. The connections are less personal and platforms are tailored to create addictions and increase use and therefore ad revenue. She cautioned individuals and parents need to monitor how much time is spent on social media and learn to manage as it is not going away.

Speaker #3 was Olivia Monson who is a Sophomore and a singer/artist who enjoys performing. She got on Social Media during the pandemic and was severely bullied. It changed her completely. Social media platforms lead to narcissism and a decline in mental health. Users get into people-pleasing, caring too much whether their posts get likes/ loves. So much so, she said that she started tailoring her art posts and pieces to specific audiences that she believed would always like her work which stifled her creativity and She also said with energy. so much information about diseases and conditions on

the internet, she and others self diagnose and sometimes even make up having syndromes such as Turret's or tics to get attention and sympathy. She was not totally negative and felt you could make good connections, get important news, and that social media could be positive. It all depends on how you use it and manage the amount and quality that you are on social media.

Speaker #4 was Gianna Howell who wants to be a teacher and loves performing in shows. Dramatically, Gianna stated without social media she would not have been born. Her parents met through social media. Though she commented on the addictive nature of social media through release of dopamine to the brain, she cited mostly beneficial uses. For example, there are 840,000 kidnapped and missing persons in the United States. NYPD and other law enforcement can spread information to help people across the planet. find these Additionally many school children are receiving education to learn how to use technology and seek out websites and applications which allow them to create and share content. They can learn and practice coding mechanics from 5th grade on. Social media is good and beneficial in moderation and to users who receive training and support. People can use it for good, to change lives in a positive way.

> After all the speakers, the judges tallied the results and speaker #4, Gianna Howell was declared the winner of the student speaker contest. She will complete next at the Zone level and hopefully the Region and District level after that. It again was a terrific contest with excellent speakers from Jennifer Oren's AP Class at Clovis West
