- LCI is bringing to resolution a rule that states a PDG cannot run for additional terms
- Dues will be voted on at the 2022 election in New Dehli. A \$7 increase phased in over 3 years.
- LCI will be a virtual election this year.
- There were no new ID's, so there can be no new ID's brought in or moved up. Falls to the Vice Presidents to choose who will be their leaders. All candidates were discussed this year for indorsement. No decision has been announced yet.
- There are currently 7 candidates for 3 VP for LCI. LCI is endorsing a candidate from Brazil
- LCI is wanting to expand on the Leo-Lion program to give them a greater role.
- Biggest change is Africa is now its own constitutional area. We now have 8.
- We are up 48,000 members in LCI
- Comments:
 - handed out over \$5M in grants to healthcare to treat patients world-wide
 - April - Spring to serve
 - May - membership
 - June - work to transition to new leadership
 - Just ask – that is how he became a Lion
 - Report your service in MyLion
 - ID Wade asked for folks to share what their main service project is.
 - USA/Canada Leadership Forum – If you have any interest in moving up in Lionism, this is the Forum you need to attend.

 - Look at LCIF for Community Service Grant in our communities. A club is eligible to request a grant for up to 15% of their total contributions to LCIF. LCIF has 3 years of donations tracked (need to confirm this)

Pacific Vision Foundation was founded in 1977 with the mission to prevent blindness and improve vision by fostering the highest level of eye care for the public. Accomplishes its mission through medical, profession, education, supporting the residency programs and research. Four entities under one umbrella. Provides financial support to the residency programs. Owns the 711 Van Ness Bldg. The Eye Institute. 89% owner/operations manager of Pacific Vision Surgery Center. PVF Pacific Vision Eye Institute Medical Group, long time partners located at the Eye Institute.

LEF and the Lions Eye Clinic:

CPMC Ophthalmology Residency Program; CPMC Ophthalmology Department; CPMC Ophthalmology Diagnostic Services, PVF Retina & Oculoplastic Fellowship Programs; Frank Stein/Paul S May Center for Low Vision Rehabilitation.

The USA/Canada Leadership Forum for 2021 is being planned for Sep. 9-11 in Des Moines, Iowa. For those who have never attended a Leadership Forum before, it can easily be one of the best experiences you can have in Lions. This year will be the 21st and a half Forum I have attended (that's because the 2020 Forum was virtual). You will enjoy the fellowship with Lions from U.S., Canada, and other countries. The speaker for the Saturday luncheon will be Lions Clubs President Elect, Dr. Jung-Yul Choi, from South Korea.

There will be many seminars to choose from over Friday and Saturday. Keep checking the Forum web site for the up-to-date information on seminars and other activities. There will also be a Strides Walk, the Lions University Graduation, and more.

Some Forum history -- The first Forum was held in 1977 in Rosemont, Illinois. At the Forum in St. Louis, Missouri on October 17-19, 1980, the Canadian Lions asked to officially join the USA Forum, thus the event officially became the USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum. Beginning at the 2001 Forum in Halifax, Nova Scotia (which was the 25th anniversary), the Forum began giving recognition to those who Lions who had attended the Forums since they began in 1977. Those Lions were named, "The Magnificent Seven", one of those Lions was MD-4's own Lion Kay Fukushima (now Past International President Kay). Those present at the 2018 Forum, were named, "The Dynamic Duo" (Past International Director Roger Richert from Washington and Past District Governor Bruce Strome from South Carolina). My first Forum was in Birmingham, Alabama in 1999. The 2001 Forum in Nova Scotia was held 9 days after the 9/11 attacks in the United States. Over 3,000 were registered to attend, with over 2,500 in attendance. There were, 2,425 registrants for the virtual Forum held in 2020.
