Membership Report PDG Al Kroell



Ready, set, go.

We are off to a brand-new start this year. We have a great district, with great Lions in it. We have been shrinking in membership for the past few years. This has been eating away at our clubs and causing frustration with club leaders.

However, I am not worried about it because I know you and I know our district. We are fighters and a lot of us, if not all of us, are competitive. I am tired of seeing us at number four in membership throughout our multiple District when we were the leader at one time. We can get back there with your help. We have a strong chance this year to be the largest in membership throughout our multiple District, and I am trusting you and each of our Lions this year to do their best in gaining membership. This all starts with a goal for your club. Each club should set a goal on membership. As a district we are going to get back to the basics, we have not had growth in our District since 2017. Past District Governor Anthony Martinez started his year by asking each club to be one positive at the end of the year. During his year the district gained 99 members, one of the largest growths that we've had in years. This was so effective that I am challenging each club to be at least one positive at the end of the year. This is a goal that any club can reach. If each club does its part, we will be 63 plus in membership at the end of the year. PDG Anthony did 99 members strong his year, let's at least increase that by one and go for an even hundred.

Our district has your back this year we are going to better serve you by asking the region chairs to be the GMT within that region. Global Membership Team (GMT) is a team and we will be working together to best serve you. We all have our game faces on with high expectations for this year, your region chair will give you better access to the help that you may need for growing your membership. And will follow-up at each of our meetings for any help that is needed. It is unrealistic to think that one person could have a positive effect on the club membership being so spread out geographically. If you have questions, need help, or have a great idea on gaining members please pass that along to your region chair or give me a call. We are all in this together. Membership is accomplished through community service projects. With good community service projects, you will not have to worry about membership. When you have a person that is asking about Lions take down their name and email address and then follow up at least three times. Handing out the flyer is good, but most of the time it will be discarded or forgotten about. I have found out that getting a person's contact information and then inviting them to your next community service project is more effective. This will help you get your +1 at the end of the year. Banner patches will be handed out at the end of the year for any club that has a plus-one member. The club in our district that gains the most in members for this year will get a different banner patch to set them apart as the top membership builder for the year. We need every Lions help in our district to build up our membership. This is all of our responsibility. I am sounding the battle cry!! And trusting you for your help. Let's get back to number one by gaining one.



1st Quarter District 4-A2 LCIF Coordinator Report PDG Lion Tony F Reyes, Sr

At the beginning of Lions Year 2022-2023, I challenged the district to raise \$150,000 over three years. This breaks down to approximately \$850/year/club over three years (60 x \$850 x 3years = \$153,000). Please work on meeting this and next years adjusted goal.

For LY 2022/2023 the district only achieved \$35,065.80. That amount includes approximately \$12,300 raised at the Melvin Jones Blindfold Dinner held on January 13, 2023.

To achieve the three-year goal with two years left in the challenge, clubs in the district should aim to raise a combined total of \$57,500 per year over the next two years. District Governor Christy agrees with this goal. If each of the 60 clubs can set an LCIF target donation of at least \$950/per year, over the next two years, we can achieve that goal.

Another way to look towards achieving this goal is to have each member commit to contributing 35/year over the next two years $1672 \times 35 \times 2 = 17,040$.

LCIF Club Participation and Recap of Donations -

LCIF Club Participation for LY 2022/2023 reached 36.6%. Only 22 of 60 clubs made donations in LY 2022-2023 for a total of \$25,988. Another \$9,028 was donated with no club identified (this includes \$6,827 donated in the district's name from the Blindfold Dinner event).

Governor Christy's goal for LCIF donations is set for at least \$50,000 for this Lions Year. Let's all work together to help achieve this goal. And we can set even higher benchmarks for the next LY.

Nine MD4 districts exceeded LCIF's 2022/2023 goal of \$25/member for the year. There is no reason District 4-A2 should not be included in that statistic. Two of those districts achieved over 400% of that goal.

Another of DG Christy's goals is to have 100% club participation. If every club in the district can make at least a minimal donation of \$20 per club, we can achieve this goal. Last year participation was 36.6% (22 of 60 clubs). I realize that \$20 per club is a long way from the amounts mentioned above, but we're talking about two different metrics.

However, you look at it, let's meet and exceed these goals early in the year.

Dining in the Dark -

Friday, January 13, 2023, the Dining in The Dark dinner was held. This was an LCIF fundraising event with the goal of helping meet DG Falguni's objectives for Lions Year 2022/2023. With over 130 seats paid for by clubs, members, and guests, we exceeded expectations. We raised almost \$13,000 for LCIF (this was credited to several clubs' and the district LCIF accounts). Clubs buying a table received a \$500 donation credit in the club(s) name.

DG Elect Christy has asked that I coordinate another event during her year. So, save this date – Saturday January 13, 2024. Details will be forthcoming. Please start promoting this event and help our new DG meet her goals.
