
Lions Clubs International

Back when Lions were just getting started, District 4 took up most of the western United States. As more Lions Clubs were added, more districts were created.

California is now Multiple District 4, having 15 districts in it. District 4-A2 is exactly in the middle of MD-4 (=California).

Multiple District 1 is Illinois.


Multiple District 2 is Texas.

District 4-A2 is made up of Lions Clubs.

All Lions must be members of clubs.

The clubs themselves are the members of a district.

• Most of the Lions Clubs in District 4-A2 are named for the city or community which they serve, and in which they meet.

- Nearby clubs are organized into zones.
- Zones have a Zone Chair, appointed annually by the District 4-A2 Governor.





Service Projects

Does District 4-A2 do projects?

- District 4-A2 can do <u>District Projects</u> if
 - Enough clubs support the project
 - with an official endorsement
 - with volunteers
 - with funds

- In the 1990's District 4-A2 endorsed a project to provide suitcases for children who get abruptly removed from dangerous homes by Child Protective Services.
- Called "<u>Kases for Kids</u>," it has now been adopted in most counties of California, several other states, and some other countries.
- Local Lions clubs
 - find a contact person at CPS,
 - find a place to store donated suitcases, and
 - CPS then takes a suitcase with them for each child they must move.

- Many families observe healthy habits and never experience diabetes ...
 until a child is born into the family with Type 1 diabetes.
- So many things can go wrong that would cost the child's life, that parents can feel wrung out. Their kids often get overprotected.
- The Diabetic Youth Foundation runs a summer camp to help these kids (and their families) have a normal week. They spend it with other kids and camp counselors who all have diabetes just like them.
- District 4-A2 recently found out their camp is in our territory! So, we adopted our newest project to rehabilitate the facilities at Camp Bearskin Meadow.

Annual Convention

- Toward the end of the Lions' year,* District 4-A2 holds its annual convention.
- There we elect a new District Governor, and celebrate what other clubs in our District have accomplished individually and together.
- Honors and awards are often presented. It's nice to get recognized for the work "above and beyond" that you as a Lion and as a club do all year.

Proud Lion Mentoring Program

- Proud Lion Mentoring Program
- For a new member to earn The Proud Lion Award they must:
- 1. Attend a club board meeting
 - 2. Participate in a club service or fund-raising activity.
 - 3. Introduce a new prospective member to the club.
 - 4. Make a visit to another club and secure a visitation slip
 - 5. Attend a zone, region, district or multiple district meeting and report back to the club.
- The goals listed above must be attained within the specified six (6) month's period and accompanied by the Protege Lion sponsor to each of the five activities.
