Lions International President 2024-2025 Fabrício Oliveira



Fabrício Oliveira of Catolé do Rocha, Paraíba, Brazil, was elected to serve as International President of Lions Clubs International at our association's 106th International Convention, from June 21 through June 25, 2024, in Melbourne, Australia. International President Fabrício is a businessman, with a post-graduate degree in business management (MBA) from Fundação Getúlio Vargas (FGV), and a degree in business administration.

A member of the Catolé do Rocha Lions Club since 1985, International President Fabrício has held several offices in the association, among them, club president, zone chairperson, region chairperson, district governor, Multiple District LA first council of governors chairperson, and international director. He also has served as multiple district leadership development chairperson, having coordinated the district governors-elect seminar, multiple district SightFirst committee chair, and chair of the district Lions Foundation. International President Fabrício also served twice as District Governors-Elect Seminar group leader.

In recognition of his service to the association he has received several awards, including the 100% Club President Award, the District Governor Excellence Medal, District Governor's Extension Award for chartering nine Lions clubs, the District Governor's Membership Growth Award (net 312), Service Award, seven Council Chairperson's Appreciation Medals, 19 International Presidents' Certificates of Appreciation, the Augustin Soliva Medal, the Paradigm Medal, nine Leadership Medals, 16 Presidential Medals, International Director Recognition Medal and the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor awarded by the association to its members. President Fabrício has also received a Key Award for sponsoring 30 new members, an Extension Certificate for sponsoring five new Leo clubs, the Global Vision Medal for his efforts in Campaign SightFirst and the Helping Hands Award given by Lions Clubs International Foundation. He has also been recognized as a Lions International Second Century Ambassador, as well as being a Multilevel Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.

In addition to his Lion achievements, International President Fabrício participates in numerous professional and community organizations, having served as the secretary of industry and commerce of the state of Paraíba and an administration council chairperson of several companies. President Fabrício served as director of the National Confederation of Shopkeepers (CNDL), chairperson of the Federation of Chambers of Shopkeepers of the State of Paraíba (FCDL-PB), chairperson of Catolé do Rocha Chamber of Shopkeepers (CDL).

International President Fabrício and his wife, Amariles, also a member of the Catolé do Rocha Lions Club and a Melvin Jones Fellow, have two daughters, a son and a granddaughter.

Lion Cheri has been with her lifelong friend and partner in service Lion Diana for 33 years. When the Defense of Marriage Act was overturned in 2013, they were finally able to marry.

After retiring from the US Army, Lion Cheri sought out a way to be in further service to her community. The Visalia Pride Lions Club offered her a home for her to pursue her passion for service. 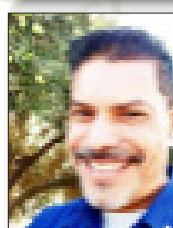

Melvin Jones



Melvin Jones was born on January 13, 1879, in Fort Thomas, Arizona, the son of a United States Army captain who commanded a troop of scouts. Later, his father was transferred, and the family moved east.

As a young man, Melvin Jones made his home in Chicago, Illinois, became

associated with an insurance firm and in 1913 formed his own agency. He soon joined the Business Circle, a businessman's luncheon group, and was shortly elected secretary. This group was one of many at that time devoted solely to promoting the financial interests of their membership. Because of their limited appeal, they were destined to disappear. Melvin Jones, then a 38-year-old Chicago business leader, had other plans.

"What if these men," Melvin Jones asked, "who are successful because of their drive, intelligence and ambition, were to put their talents to work improving their communities?" Thus, at his invitation, delegates from men's clubs met in Chicago to lay the groundwork for such an organization and on June 7, 1917, Lions Clubs International was born.

Melvin Jones eventually abandoned his insurance agency to devote himself full time to Lions at the International Headquarters in Chicago. It was under his dynamic leadership that Lions clubs earned the prestige necessary to attract civic-minded members.

The association's founder was also recognized as a leader by those outside the association. One of his greatest honors was in 1945 when he represented Lions Clubs International as a consultant in San Francisco, California, at the organization of the United Nations.

Melvin Jones, the man whose personal code "You can't get very far until you start doing something for somebody else" became a guiding principle for public-spirited people the world over, he died June 1, 1961 at 82 years of age.

MD4 Excellence Award

CRITERIA (Presented at District Conventions)

1. To be considered for this award, the nominee must be a Lion in good standing in a club in good standing within Multiple District Four.
2. The Lion must show great leadership ability and demonstrate that ability in thought and deed.
3. A nominee shall have exhibited leadership by taking initiative with projects for their club and district.
4. The Lion must have demonstrated dedication to the Lions organization and served as a role model for all Lions.
5. Consideration for nomination must be given to lifetime achievements of the candidate as well as to the candidate's Lionistic attitude.

PROCEDURES

1. Two (2) award for each district with up to 1,200 members, three (3) awards for districts with over 1,200 to 2,000 members and four (4) awards for districts with over 2,000 members as recorded on December 31.
2. A Lion will only receive the award one time. The award will be presented at the district's annual convention by a current MD-4 District Governor on behalf of the multiple district.
3. Nominations for this award may come from clubs or the district cabinet and shall be in writing. Each nomination will contain full justification for the award, showing that the nominee is the most deserving and the nominee meets the criteria for the honor.
4. The district cabinet reviews all nominations and selects the recipient(s) at a regularly scheduled meeting of the cabinet. The selection shall require a majority of votes cast of the cabinet members present. The decision of the district cabinet shall be final. The name(s) of the district recipient(s) shall be submitted to the Council of Governors prior to the February Council of Governors meeting.
5. The District Governor, Vice District Governors, Cabinet Secretary, Cabinet Treasurer and the Immediate Past District Governor are ineligible for this award.
6. The Multiple District Four Excellence Award medals will be made available through the MD-4 office. The award will consist of a medallion to be hung from a presentation ribbon and a resolution of appreciation issued by the Council of Governors.
7. Nominees must be submitted to the District Cabinet by the end of the October. Nominees are submitted to MD4 at the end of the calendar year and then approved by the Council at the Mid-Winter meeting. A form is available on the MD4 website if needed, but it is not necessary, a written nomination is required.

This is a once in a Lifetime award. Good Luck!

Consideration for this award can include service at District level and above.

MD-4 LEO of the Year

Consideration is given to service and accomplishments outside of LEO as well as participation in LEO clubs activities and support of their District.

MD-4 Kay & Denise Fukushima Couple of the Year

A couple selected by their District Governor who have shown exemplary leadership on behalf of the District and Multiple district, based on theme, "One World, One Heart." Consider service through the years, not just the current year.

MD-4 Lions Club of the Year

This award is for a Club who has gone above and beyond in their service to their community during the time period July 1 thru June 30. It should embody our motto "We Serve." The amount of money spent should NOT be a consideration and the project should NOT be a Club fundraiser. The Club project(s) should be "Hands on" in nature and for which members turn out to do physical labor or service for the betterment of their community. Previous Academy Award winners are not eligible.

MD-4 Most Outstanding Club Project for the Year

(Small Club 20 members and below) (Medium Club 21 – 39 members)

(Large Club 40 and above members) This award is designed for a Club who has a "Signature" project; for which the Club is most renowned. The amount of money spent can be considered and the project could be a fundraiser. Districts wishing to participate should nominate projects done during the time period July 1 thru June 30.

Previous Award winners in this category are not eligible.

PROCEDURES

- All Lions in good standing within their Club, District, MD-4 and LCI are eligible.
- A District Governor may submit only one nominee per each category.
- The deadline for nomination submission is November 30 to MD4.
- Exceptions are approved by the current COG prior to November 30th.

Short Tail / Long Tail Award

Short Tail Award (July 1st to June 30th)

Any Lion may earn a Short Tail award by visiting a regular meeting of at least 11 clubs in a Region of District 4-A2. For paper reporting acknowledging your visit, enter the date and obtain the signature of the President or secretary of the club visited. Forward the completed set of signatures to the District Visitation chair by March 31st for recognition at the District Convention, or by June 30th, the end of the Lions year, in which the visits were made. You can report visits as they take place by e-mail, but are subject to the same deadlines as paper reporting. Individuals cannot count their club's regular meetings. Every club in a Region shall be defined as those in existence and meeting regularly more than half of the contest year. Region chairs, Governors and Vice-Governors shall be ineligible for this award during the Lion year in which they hold any of these offices.

Long Tail Award (Membership date until completion for a Long Tail Award)

Any Lion may earn a Long Tail award by visiting a regular meeting of every club in District 4-A2. For paper reporting, acknowledging your visit, annotate the date and obtain the signature of the President or secretary of the club visited. Forward the completed set of signatures to the District Visitation chair upon completion. "Every club in the district" shall be defined as those in existence when the Lion completed the visit and turned in the documentation. District Governors and Past District Governors shall be ineligible for this award based on any visits made during the Lion year in office.

District Visitations April 1 - March 31

Report visitations to the District Visitation Chair on a timely basis. Official club visitations are reported by the end of the following month of visitation. You can report by paper documentation or e-mail.

- The visiting club must e-mail reports acknowledging the date & time of visitation.
- Paper reports must be signed by the president or secretary of the hosting club, (or other representative if the president & secretary are absent) acknowledging your group was there.
- Both reports must indicate the following:
 - the name of the visiting club, and the name of the hosting club
 - the date, time and place of the visitation
 - the one-way mileage from the visiting club's regular meeting place to the place of visitation.
 - the names of the visiting Lions, Lionesses or Leos. (Visitors who are not yet members cannot be counted. You may list them anyway, but you must indicate they are not members)

NOTE: Do not enter visitations on a monthly activity report, nor are the entries reported to your Zone or Region Chair.

Visitation Rules

- Club's must observe rules of decorum and must achieve the minimum participation for an Official Visitation. Late reports will earn only 50% of the points of a timely report.
- Reports postmarked or delivered after March 31st are not counted.
- Club's must visit a regular meeting of a 4-A2 Lions club, or a project of the club, zone, region or district.
- Club's may visit a regular meeting or project of a Lions Club outside District 4-A2.
- Club's may visit a governor's cabinet meeting, District 4-A2 convention, or New Member Recognition Night. Only one visitation can be counted to clubs visited in the same day with overlapping meeting times, e.g., only one lunch meeting per day.

Rules of Decorum

- At least one week in advance inform the President or Secretary of the club being visited the approximate number of visitors to expect, and the date of the proposed visitation.
- Bells, gavels and banners are the only items subject to "borrowing" and then only between the opening and closing of the meeting. Any property taken outside these rules will void the visitation. See also District By-Laws, Article IV Section 10(h).
- The hosting club President should invite the visiting club President to sit at the head table.

Minimum Participation

For a visitation to be official, the visiting club must have:

- Small Clubs less than 20 members - at least 3 members attending.
- Medium Clubs 20 to 35 member - at least 4 members attending.
- Large Clubs more than 35 members - at least 5 members attending.

How to Earn Club Contest Points:

- 1 pt. for every mile traveled one-way from your meeting place to the Lions club meeting being visited, multiplied by the number of Lions and Leos participating in the Official Visitation.
- 50 pts. if the club visited is in your zone,
- 75 pts. if the club visited is not in your zone, but is in your region
- 100 pts. if the club is not in your region, but is in District 4-A2
- 5 pts for every person attending a virtual visitation

Any visitation that qualifies as "official" will earn a minimum of 100 pts.

- Bonus points for officially visiting all clubs in a zone: 50 points.
- Bonus points for officially visiting all clubs in a region: another 75 points.
- Bonus points for officially visiting all clubs in the district: another 400 points.

Points for official visitations outside District 4-A2 are limited to 200 points maximum per Lion, Lioness or Leo. In the case of a repeat visit to the same hosting club, the visit earning the most points in that contest year is the one counted. District Governor Visitation Protocol

The visit of the District Governor is one of the highlights of the Lions year. Certain rules of protocol apply for the official visit.

The Governor maintains a very busy schedule during the year and courtesy would suggest that the Governor be contacted, in writing, suggesting a minimum of three (3) dates for the official visit.

The Governor is the only speaker to be scheduled for the meeting. Do not expect the Governor to compete with another speaker or with long, drawn-out business or board meetings. Usually, rules are suspended and all reports are tabled until the next regular meeting. Have an agenda to work from and start the meeting on time. Make sure all of the details are done in advance, greeters are present, bell and banner displayed, region or zone chairmen invited, meal planned and, if a gift is being presented, make sure it is available at the meeting. Visiting Lions are not allowed to “steal” the host Lions club items.

Notify the Governor, in writing, of all special club events and extend an invitation to attend. If the Governor is expected to be a participant in the event, provide advance notification, in writing, as to the level of participation requested by the club.

When the District Governor is recognized at any Lions meeting, club or district level, all Lions should rise and remain standing until the Governor signals them to be seated not only is this proper protocol, it is recognition of the office.

If a club wishes the Governor to induct new members during the course of an official visit, notice of the induction should be provided in advance and provide a list of names of new members, and their sponsors. Make sure new member kits are ready for presentation.

The Governor can be introduced by the club president or one of the cabinet officers. This should be done with dignity and include information concerning the Governor’s home club, business, offices held, Lionistic activities and family, if appropriate. Introduction of the Governor should be done only once when being presented to the assembly for remarks. The Governor sits to the immediate right of the podium with the President to the immediate left. It would be suggested that thirty (30) minutes be allowed for remarks by the Governor.

B. Seating

C. Introduction

The Club President / Meeting Chairman introduces the Zone Chairman who in turn introduces the Region Chairman. The Region Chairman introduces the visiting District Governor who will introduce other members of this cabinet from the person with the lowest rank in the order of precedence to the person with the highest.

When spouses are present, they should be introduced with the Lion member (i.e. “ District Governor John Doe and his wife, Mary.”)

D. Program

1. The Governor’s talk is your program.
2. No other program should be planned.
3. Induction of new members is the most appropriate during the Governors visit, but please give the Governor advance notice.

Youth Protection

YOUTH PROTECTION POLICY

Multiple District 4 Lions (MD4) has an excellent record of supporting youth through Lions Youth Exchange, Leos, scholarship programs, mentoring and literacy initiatives, and other youth programs.

In developing and implementing events and programs involving youth, the Districts and Lions Clubs in MD4 MUST adopt and enforce the following Statement of conduct for Working with Youth and the Youth Protection Policy and Procedures provisions in this document. MD4 strives to create and maintain a safe environment for all youth who participate in Lion activities. To the best of their ability, Lions, Lions' spouses and partners, and other volunteers MUST safeguard the children and young people they come into contact with and protect them from physical, sexual, mental and emotional abuse. (Appendix A) MD4 requires all Districts and Lions Clubs to address the issue of youth protection, and to follow the MD4 Youth Protection Policy and Procedures. A District/Club may establish additional policies and procedures as determined appropriate to protect the safety and well-being of all who participate in Lion Youth Service Programs. MD4 is committed to the protection of the youth we serve, Lions and our volunteers. School based Leo Clubs that meet on the school site, have a faculty school advisor and follow California school district clearance policy and procedures are exempt from this process. The Leo Activities in these Leo Clubs are considered a school based activity. A letter from the school district identifying the faculty advisor and name of the Leo Club is required for MD4 records. Non-school based Leo Club advisors and volunteers are not exempt from this process. All other Lion Youth Programs advisors and volunteers (such as, but not limited to Youth Exchange, Kids in Sight, Youth Outreach) are not exempt from this process. Lions Clubs may choose to have more stringent requirements than this policy and procedures provide, but not less.

Leo Club Fees Common Questions

Leo club organization fee

A US\$100 Leo Club Organization Fee is a flat fee billed to the sponsoring Lions club, regardless of the number of Leo charter members.

The organization fee covers supplies and associated freight for:

- The Leo Club Certificate of Organization
- Leo lapel pins for all charter members
- The Leo club officer kit
- The Lions club sponsor kit

The Leo Club Organization Fee does not include Leo new member kits.

Leo new member entrance fee

The Leo New Member Entrance Fee has been eliminated.

Sponsoring Lions clubs have the option to purchase Leo lapel pins for Leo members entering an existing Leo club via the LCI Store.

Sponsoring Lions clubs have the option to purchase Leo new member kits via the LCI Store. Some kit items, such as Leo membership guides, cards and certificates are now available for free download via MyLCI.

Can Leos order supplies from headquarters?

As a sponsored activity of a Lions club, a Leo club does not have an account with the association. However, members of a Leo club can purchase items through the Lions Club Supplies store using a credit card, US dollar check or money order. A club

can also bill the account of the Lions club sponsor if authorization is given by an officer of the sponsoring Lions club.

Annual leo club sponsor levy

Lions clubs are assessed an annual levy of US\$100 for each Leo club they sponsor.

The US\$100 fee appears on the sponsoring Lions club's July billing statement from International Headquarters each year.

In addition, when a Lions club initially charters a Leo club, the Leo levy is waived for that fiscal year only.

Leo levy credit for a terminated Leo club shall be given only if the sponsoring Lions club submits a signed Leo Club Termination Form (Leo-86) to the Leo Club Program Department at International Headquarters by October 31. Credit shall be given only for the current fiscal year.

Can Lions clubs pay Leo fees and levies from their activity account?

Yes. Leo clubs are an official Lions club activity. Therefore, Leo fees and levies can be paid from the Lions club's activity and/or administrative account. Likewise, either account may fund the administrative expenses of the Leo club.

Can Leo clubs pay their own fees or levies?

Indirectly. A sponsor Lions club is responsible for all fees and levies relating to its Leo club. However, some Leo clubs choose to repay their sponsor Lions clubs for these items.

Your Guide to Reporting Leo Membership

Reporting membership data to Lions Clubs International is the first step for setting your club and members up for success — your club can gauge its health by looking at membership numbers, and your reported members can access a variety of helpful tools with a Lion Account. Below you'll find helpful information and tips for reporting your Leo club's membership.

Who can report for Leo clubs in MyLCI?

- » Leo club advisor
- » Leo club president
- » Leo club secretary
- » Sponsoring Lions club president
- » Sponsoring Lions club secretary

Reporting Leo club members and officers:

- » Gives reported members the ability to create a Lion Account, access the Lions Learning Center (LLC) and view activity in MyLion.
- » Ensures that each reported Leo's service history is accurate.
- » Simplifies transitioning from a Leo to a Leo-Lion through MyLCI.
- » Facilitates accurate club membership records.
- » Allows Leo clubs to understand their club's health and track growth trends.
- » Keeps districts, multiple districts and Lions International connected by providing accurate titles and contact information.

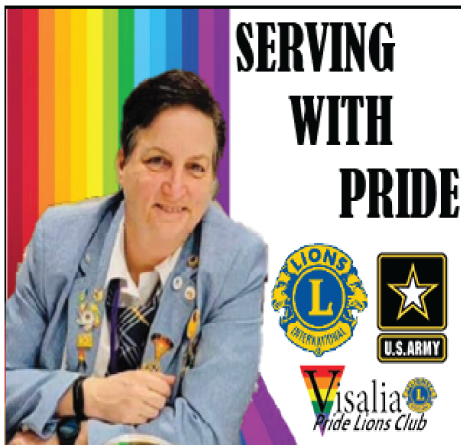

Helpful tips

- » Sponsoring Lions club presidents must annually report the Leo club advisor. Once reported, the Leo club advisor can report the club officers and members for the year.
- » Leo club advisors must affirm in MyLCI that they have received permission from a parent or legal guardian to include Leos under the age of majority.
- » Officers should review their club roster several times a year to include new members and close records for those who have left the club.
- » To access their Lion Account, members must be reported in MyLCI by one of the five club officers.
- » When registering for a Lion Account, members must make sure birthdays, email addresses and/or mobile numbers match club records. Email addresses must be unique to the member.
- » While every Leo can have a Lion Account, only reported Leo officers have access to MyLCI.

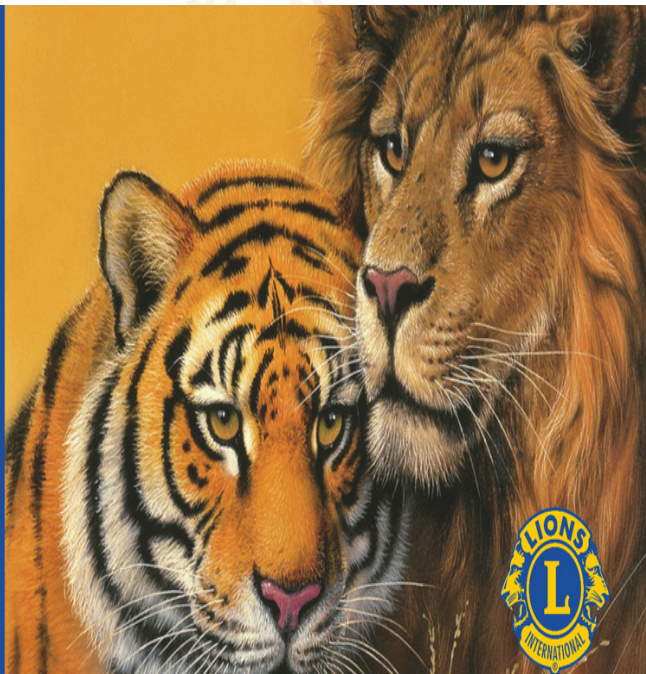

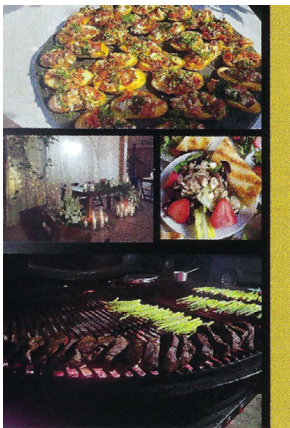
